Dear Families,

Welcome back to our 2020 year. We welcome all new and returning families and staff to our St. Peter's family for another wonderful year of learning.

This week we welcomed our new staff, **Mr Adrain Platek** (1/2P), **Ms Rachel Giuffrida** (3/4G), **Ms Sasha Sant** (5/6S), **Señora DeGiusti** (**Spanish**) and **Mr Bernard Mogg** (**Physical Education**) to our school. We have also welcomed over 20 new families to our school and 25 new Preps. I know you'll make everyone very welcome.

### **Opening of the Year School Mass**

Thank you to our families who joined us for our beginning of the year mass today. Congratulations to those children who were voted SRC members by their classmates.

#### School Fees and Health Care Card

Remember the first instalment of school fees and your levies are now due. If you have a health care card you are entitled to a reduction of \$125 from your fees. Please present your card to the office asap.

### Change to lunch eating time

As mentioned during learning conversations we have moved our eating time to the end of lunch now. This way children can have their play first prior to coming inside to eat their lunch and calm themselves prior to commencing their learning. We are finding this is having a very positive effect on the children so far. We will be evaluating this change at the end of term one with the staff and students.

### **Brain Food and Healthy Lunch**

Please remember to supply your child/ren with a healthy snack (fruit of vegetables) for their brain food break at 10.00am each day. Also, a reminder that we encourage healthy food for lunch. Hot chips and take away food will not be passed onto children as this food

impacts on their ability to concentrate and learn. All children should bring their lunch with them to school in their school bag.

#### **2020 Sacrament Dates**

Year three Catholic children will be receiving the Sacrament of **Reconciliation on Thursday March 12th at 7.00pm** and the Sacrament of **Eucharist on Sunday June 14th** at 10.00am. The Year Five and Six Catholic children will be receiving the Sacrament of **Confirmation on Thursday April 16th** at 7.00pm. All Sacraments will be held at St. Paul's Catholic Church.

#### **Box of Tissues**

We ask that every child in the school brings one or two boxes of tissues to share with their class throughout the year. If your child's class runs out of tissues your teacher might send a note home requesting another box from every child in your class.

### **Contacting Staff**

As always you are welcome to contact your child's teacher during business hours. While you are welcome to email staff, please note that emails will be answered within 48 hours as teachers are unable to access emails during learning time. No staff member will return emails or phone calls out of business hours (8.30am - 5.00pm).

#### **Bell times**

Please ensure the children have arrived at school by 8.45am each morning. The bell goes at 8.50am and children begin learning immediately. Children need time to unpack their bags and be organised for the day. Arriving after 8.50am is putting your child's learning at risk. The school is going to focus on 100% of children arriving 100% of the time this year. Please support your children in this venture.

#### **Parent Handbook**

Please take time to read the parent handbook that you were given at Learning Conversations. There are many tips and information about the school in this handbook that you will be able to refer to throughout the year.

### **Parking Road Safety**

It is that time of the year when you need to remember to check the parking signs around the school to ensure you are legally parked. **Please do not park in our neighbours driveways or block these**. Please also model road safety to your children by crossing at the children's crossing to keep them safe. As a driver you need to remember to stop at the crossing if children are waiting to cross or are already on the crossing. Please park and drop off children where it is legal and safe.

## Arrival and Pick up Times

Please remember that the school gates open at 8.30am and school finishes at 3.15 each day. If you need to drop your child off earlier or collect them later, please enrol your child in the **Kelly Club Before or After Care program** (located at Glengala Primary). Carers will walk the children to St. Peter's school in the morning and collect them after school in the afternoon. Please contact **Angela at Kelly Club on 0423941496** 

to enrol your child. Staff have meetings at 3.30pm each day and are unable to supervise children after this time.

### Library book bags

This year we have provided every child with a 40th Anniversary bag to use for their library bag. Please remember if your child does not have their library bag they won't be able to borrow any books from the library.

### **Family Engagement Team**

Congratulations to the 2019 Family Engagement Team who Raised \$3,000 last year. This money will go towards our future data projector in the gym.

### If you love reading come and donate or swap a book:

We established a book (novels) swap program for adults, located in our meeting room. If you have a love of reading and would like to borrow a book, all you have to do to begin is to donate one book, borrow another and then enjoy your new novel. When you've finished that novel, return it to the bookshelf and borrow another. We look forward to hearing which books you are enjoying. Please feel free to visit the meeting room and borrow a book at anytime.

#### **Uniform**

Please note that Preps, 3/4s and 5/6 P will need to wear their sports uniform on a Tuesday this year, while 1/2s and 5/6 S will need to wear their sports uniform on a Wednesday this year. All other days children must wear their black school shoes (not sneakers).

Please remember to wear the correct school uniform at all times. Please note that leggings or stockings are not permitted to be worn under the summer dress. Girls need to wear white socks with the summer uniform.

We have had such positive feedback from families, children and staff about the opportunity to meet one another before the start of the school year. After such positive feedback we will definitely continue this process in 2021.
