

Dear Families,

While the Government continues to insist on schools being open, we will remain open. However, we do understand if you wish to keep your children home during these unprecedented times. Today teachers have prepared working at home packs for the children. These are not for the holidays, but to be saved until when and if we are closed.

Year 3-6 Chromebooks

Due to these extenuating circumstances we have decided to allow children to keep their Chromebooks at home over these holidays in case they need them to do their online learning at the start of next term. Please ensure these are kept in a safe place and there is no need for children to be on their Chromebooks during the holiday period. Staff will not be setting home learning for the holidays.

NCCD

As always during Term Two St Peter's will be completing and submitting the NCCD (Nationally Consistent Collection of Data) on school students with a Disability.

WHAT IS THE NCCD?

The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD) takes place every year. The NCCD is a collection that counts:

- the number of school students receiving an adjustment or 'help' due to disability.
- the level of adjustment they are receiving to access education on the same basis as other students.

Students are counted in the NCCD if they receive ongoing adjustments at school due to disability. This 'help' allows them to access education on the same basis as a child without disability. The NCCD uses the definition of disability in the Disability Discrimination Act 1992. Schools provide this information to education authorities.

A note will be going home with further details of the NCCD and a fact sheet is available on the school app.
