Sunday's Gospel - Jesus Walks on the Water (Mt 14:22-33)

Immediately he made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, but by this time the boat, battered by the waves, was far from the land, for the wind was against them. And early in the morning he came walking toward them on the sea. But when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified, saying, "It is a ghost!" And they cried out in fear. But immediately Jesus spoke to them and said, "Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid."

Peter answered him, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." He said, "Come." So Peter got out of the boat, started walking on the water, and came toward Jesus. But when he noticed the strong wind, he became frightened, and beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!" Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught him, saying to him, "You of little faith, why did you doubt?" When they got into the boat, the wind ceased. And those in the boat worshiped him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God."

As I reflected on Sunday's Gospel I remembered how moved I was nearly 12 months ago when I visited the place of Peter's Primacy in Tabgha, Israel. According to tradition this is the spot where Jesus is said to have laid out a breakfast of bread and fish for the Apostles, and told Peter to "Feed my sheep" (John 21:17) after the miraculous catch, the third time he appeared to them after his resurrection.

With these memories and this week's Gospel in mind, I took time to reflect on The Sea of Galilee and how moved I was to walk in the water where Peter had fished and where Jesus had demanded complete trust from Peter. During these times of Pandemic, I have been called to reach deeply into my faith and trust in God. Like Peter I have not always been as faithful as I could. I too have been frightened and at times, I have felt like sinking. Yet like Peter, I have trusted in God and during my time of 'humanness' I have asked God to protect me and keep me strong. I too pray for you that as these weeks of isolation continue, you too can find strength in Peter's trust and faith in Jesus as you need. I leave you with today's Gospel as a source of strength for you during the coming weeks.

Stage 4 Restrictions

At present there will be 3 adults on site at all times if there are children on site, but we do ask that you keep your children at home if you can, so I can keep staff at home and keep them safe. I continue to thank you all for supporting your children and their teachers in keeping everyone safe.
