Dear Families,

We are so pleased that from next Wednesday we will have our entire St. Peter's family back together.

I realize things keep moving as to what is opening up and when. I thank you for your support and flexibility in all that we are doing to keep our children at school and safe.

Sadly, we have a number of families suffering COVID-19 and one class that has already had to isolate for 14 days. Thankfully due to our extremely successful Covid safe practices we were able to have Prep P return to site and this was mainly due to our mask wearing and bubble approach. While we realise that mask wearing is not compulsory in year Prep to 2, on this occasion it has kept our children safe. So, while this is a family choice to wear masks (years Prep to 2), I thank you all who are supporting this approach with your children. The school has been cleaned and we are completely safe to be onsite once again.

Specialist Classes

From Tuesday November 9 Specialist classes will resume for our year 1-4 children. From Wednesday November 10 our Prep and 5/6 children will have their specialist classes. This will mean the children go back to our normal timetable and are able to wear sports clothes on these days.

Arrival times

When we return to school it will be vital that your child/ren arrives at school on time at 8.30. This allows them time to sanitise their hands, unpack their bag and organise themselves for a productive day of learning. We find that children who arrive late to school often have an unsettled day. Some children will be feeling very anxious about returning to school so please support your child/ren by having them here on time.

Departure time

From Wednesday November 3 we will be returning to staggered pick up times.

3.05 - Prep, Year 1/2, Aftercare and siblings will depart school3.15 - All remaining students from Year 3 to 6 will depart school

First Communion

We are very excited that we have been able to secure a time for our year 3 and 4 Catholic children to make their First Holy Communion. This will be held on **Saturday November 27, 2021 at 10.00am in St. Paul's Church**. Further details to follow regarding numbers and so forth, but I do know to attend, you will need to be double vaccinated and have proof of this on the day.

Art Show

The 2021 art show has been moved to **Thursday November 25**. Further details to follow once we have approval from Catholic Education to hold this event. Anyone over 12 will need to prove they are double vaccinated to be able to attend this event.

We are very excited that our 2022 Prep Transition is able to go ahead. On these days you will need to bring your 2022 Prep Child and yourselves for a family meeting. You will be required to be double vaccinated to attend the family information session.

Swimming Program

Prep - 2 cancelled

Year 3- 6 our 2021 swimming program has moved to a one-off **Life Saving Victoria Mega Beach Day** focusing on beach safety. The program will be held at Port Melbourne Beach on Thursday December 2nd in the afternoon. Our year 3-6 children will not return to school until approximately 3.45pm on this day. The cost of this program will be covered by your 2021 swimming levy as it is a very expensive program but one that we thought very worthwhile for our children and means that our year 3-6 child can learn about water safety at the beach.

Assemblies

Positive COVID test

Thank you to all of our families who continue to pay their outstanding fees. We are now down to **\$36,000** remaining in outstanding fees that we require to be paid asap.
