Dear Families,

Welcome to our 2022 school year. We welcome all new and returning families and staff to our St. Peter's family for another wonderful year of learning.

As always, the children have been fabulous at wearing their masks and sanitising, while making the most of our outdoor learning spaces which we are so lucky to be able to utilize.

We have also welcomed 30 new children and their families to our school this year including 22 Prep children. I know you'll make everyone very welcome.

School Fees and Health Care Card

Remember the first instalment of school fees was due last week. Please pay these or apply to go on a payment plan. If you have a health care card you are entitled to a reduction of \$125 from your fees. Please present your card to the office asap.

This year Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) has introduced a concessional fee policy. I will be sending out more information re this policy as it comes to hand, but at this stage I am still waiting for clarification from MACS in relation to what this policy actually covers. When I have this information families with a health care card will be entitled to apply for fee concessions if you are unable to meet our current fee structure.

Uniform

Please remember to wear the correct school uniform at all times, including black school shoes (not sneakers). Please note that leggings or stockings are not permitted to be worn under the summer dress. Girls need to wear socks with the summer uniform. Please note from now on all children are asked to wear **navy socks**. White and grey socks are no longer school uniform. We are selling the navy socks at our uniform shop.

I have had a great deal of positive feedback about our new uniform. Our old uniform is still available in limited sizes at a buy one, get one free promotion. Your children will be able to wear the old uniform for 2022 and 2023.

Specialist Days

Tuesday - Year 1/2 and 5/6 children (wear sports uniform)
Wednesday - Year Prep and Year 3/4 children (wear sports uniform)

Please note sneakers and tracksuit pants may only be worn on your child's specialist day.

Contacting Staff

As always you are welcome to contact your child's teacher during business hours. While you are welcome to email staff, please note that emails will be answered within 48 hours as teachers are unable to access emails during learning time. No staff member will return emails or phone calls out of business hours (8.00am - 5.00pm).

Arrival and Pick up Times

Please remember that the school gates open at 8.30am and school finishes at 3.15 each day. If you need to drop your child off earlier or collect them later, please enrol your child in the **Kelly Club Before or After Care program** (located at Glengala Primary). Careers will walk the children to St. Peter's school in the morning and collect them after school in the afternoon. Please contact **Angela at Kelly Club on 0423941496** to enrol your child. Staff have meetings at 3.30pm each day and are unable to supervise children after this time.

Bell times

Please ensure the children have arrived at school by 8.30am each morning. The bell goes at 8.50am and children begin learning immediately. Children need time to unpack their bags and be organised for the day. Arriving after 8.50am is putting your child's learning at risk. The school is going to focus on 100% of children arriving 100% of the time on time this year. Please support your children in this venture.

Parent Handbook

Please take time to read the parent handbook that has come home with your child today. There are many tips and information about the school in this handbook that you will be able to refer to throughout the year.

Parking Road Safety

It is that time of the year when you need to remember to check the parking signs around the school to ensure you are legally parked. **Please do not park in our neighbours' driveways or block these**. Please also model road safety to your children by crossing at the children's crossing to keep them safe. As a driver you need to remember to stop at the crossing if children are waiting to cross or are already on the crossing. Please park and drop off children where it is legal and safe.

Learning Conversations will be held via google meets next Monday. Please note children will be at school from 8.30am until 11.30am and must be collected promptly at 11.30 so that teachers are free to meet with families for the rest of the day.
