## **PAT ART Project Presentation**

I would like to congratulate **Mr. Jock McMillan, Ms. Sasha Sant and Ms. Sharon Campbell** on the work they have completed as part of the MACS Western Region PAT ART project. As many of you are aware this work featured in the 'The Age' on January 8th 2023, highlighting the great work that is happening at St. Peter's in the area of 'abstract reasoning' which supports the unlocking of numeracy and literacy skills. To continue the promotion of this work, Jock was asked to present our learning to all Catholic School leadership teams from the Western Region of Catholic Education last Friday alongside Professor John Munroe from ACU. This work is another example of how we are achieving our strategic plan goal; 'To clarify a shared understanding of evidence-based teaching practices, while embedding these across the school community.' I recommend you ask Jock about this project if you would like to know more.

### **Staff Conference**

As you have already been informed, this Thursday March 9 and Friday March 10 our staff will be working with Helen Christensen from MACS on improving our understanding of our First Nations people. As part of the AITSL standards (see below), teachers are expected to know strategies for teaching Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students. Hence why we are focusing on this area of learning at our staff conference this year. This is also particularly important in 2023 as our country moves towards voting for a voice to parliament referendum later this year.
